

Treasurer's Report: Marijane Ember reported the balances covering the period January 1, 2024 to February 29, 2024. There was an opening balance of \$11,194.35, income of \$170.19 and expenses of \$3030.40 resulting in a balance of \$8334.24. John Bratton presented the 2024-2025 Budget which had been approved by the Executive Board. Don Rineer made a motion to accept the report and Budget. Marty Hudacs seconded the motion. The motion passed.

- Thank you to the Hospitality Committee, Sue Hoxworth and Becky for arranging the lovely luncheon.
- Because we are not holding a major fundraiser this spring the Board has asked members for a \$25.00 donation toward scholarships and grants. To date we have received \$655.00.
- The Spring Communiqué was emailed to members who provided email addresses; they also received a hard copy. In the future those providing an email address will only receive an email copy. This will result in significant savings.
- An ad hoc committee met and determined the need for some changes to our by-laws. The proposed changes have been approved by the Executive Board and were presented to the membership via the newsletter, posted on the website and print copies were available at the luncheon. A vote will be taken at the November General Membership meeting to approve the changes.
- All members are encouraged to consider taking an active role in the organization by joining a committee. Immediate needs include the Educational Support Committee, Members Benefits Committee, Publicity Committee and the Program Committee.

New Business:

- Marijane Ember announced an exciting new event. Trivia Day will take place Sunday, November 17, from 12:30 to 4:00 at The Lititz Springs Inn (formerly the General Sutter). Admission is \$25.00 per person. Tickets will be available at the picnic and the November luncheon as well as directly from Marijane.


