

LANCASTER COUNTY SCHOOL RETIREES (LCSR) AWARD SCHOOL EMPLOYEE GRANTS FOR THE 2019-2020 SCHOOL YEAR

As part of its mission to continue supporting education in retirement, the Lancaster County School Retirees association has awarded the following grants to local educators and schools for the 2019-2020 school year.

Recipients are:

Tamara Armstrong, Phys Ed Instructor, at **Rreamstown Elementary** - \$500 for Speed Stacks Sport Pack, which promotes ambidexterity and eye-hand coordination with all students, as well as provide success to students who may not be as athletically skilled as other students.

Eric Balak, 5th Grade Teacher at **Hans Herr Elementary** - \$500 for aquaponics equipment and supplies that will be used to educate the students about the ways communities can use the science of aquaponics to help produce food while protecting the earth's resources and environment.

Nicole Campbell, 2nd Grade Teacher at **Leola Elementary** - \$500 for equipment and supplies for a "Guinea Pig STEM" project that has teams of students using math, engineering, and other 21st century skills in designing and building a guinea pig cage. Students will write and record a video of the complete process, then publish it on YouTube for a global audience.

Michael Deiter, 4th Grade Teacher at **Park Elementary** - \$494 for tools in a "Weather Tools and Data Collection" project that is cross curricular in math and science, and allows students to collect and analyze data, identify patterns, and attempt to make weather predictions.

Lindsey Garrett, Science Teacher at **Columbia High School** - \$300 for mBot Robots project, that has students building little robots, and learning and developing coding for the robots to do a variety of tasks.

Olivia Greter, Science teacher at **Gerald Huesken Middle School** - \$400 for a "Martian Colonization Project" where teams of students will use vermicomposting to grow food in a manner as would be necessary in colonizing a planet such as Mars.

Erin Kreger, Spanish Teacher at **Cocalico High School** - \$250 towards a "Multiculture Night where students will plan, advertise for, and host an event where participants will learn about, and develop appreciation for the cultural diversity in the community.

Jacqueline Phillips, School Nurse at **Reidenbaugh Elementary** - \$300 for "Wellness Pedometers" for use in walking challenges posed to the students. These challenges not only promote a healthy lifestyle, but also engage students in conversation and provide moments of personal self-reflection while having fun in friendly competition with other students and classrooms.

Alicia Shirk, Learning Support Teacher and **Jodi Haberstroh**, School Nurse at **Park Elementary** - \$200 for "Tactile Stimulation" materials to help students who are hyperactive or have problems sitting still in a classroom. These materials will help the student to incorporate sensory strategies to increase engagement and learning in the classroom.

Amanda Summers, 4th Grade Teacher at **Providence Elementary** - \$300 towards a "Student Choice Reading Initiative", a project which would encourage the students, especially the disadvantaged, to select books on things they care about and assist them in starting their own home library.

Kimberly Sweigart, FCS Teacher at **Warwick High School** - \$220 for a "Garment Designer" computer program that will allow students to create and print patterns for garments of their own unique design, which they will then assemble and present.

All projects for the grants are to be completed by June 30, 2020. Upon completion, the recipient is to submit a description and evaluation of the project, which will be shared in the LCSR membership newsletter or presented at a Membership Meeting.
