HAVE YOU MET?

When you drive along Marietta Avenue on the west edge of Lancaster City do you ever take a moment to reflect on the historical treasure located there? I am, of course, referring to Wheatland, home of President James Buchanan and the Lancaster County Historical Society Museum. **Marguerite (Geri) Kull** is extremely familiar with the site serving as a docent and providing guided tours to visitors from all over the world.




Geri began volunteering at Wheatland after her retirement from Warwick Middle School in 2013 but her interest in history goes back to childhood. Growing up in western Pennsylvania Geri often visited sites like Fort Ligonier and Bushy Run Battlefield with her family. Her father was a collector of arrowheads, amassing a collection of 2,000 during his lifetime. As an adult Geri enjoys visiting other President's homes and Presidential Libraries. She has visited 10 so far and has plans to tour a few more in New England soon.

After her retirement Geri began her preparing to become a docent at Wheatland by shadowing other tour guides. Each guide offers a slightly different *slant* when sharing the significance of Wheatland; they may focus on the antique furniture, the politics of the time, the architecture, the art work, local customs, or other themes. After experiencing a variety of tours the potential tour guide studies recommended reading materials and creates his/her tour narration. When ready, the individual gives a tour to the Director. If approved that person is then put on the schedule as a docent giving tours to the public.

With her background in education, Geri often presents tours to school fieldtrip groups as well as the multiage groups who tour on any given day. During the Holiday season she gives special Yule Tide Tours.

Geri lives in Manheim Township with her husband, Chris. They have two children and two grandchildren. In addition to volunteering at Wheatland Geri also volunteers on a Manheim Township Youth Aid Panel and on the Executive Board of LCSR. Geri is a graduate of Seton Hill University and holds a M.S. in School Counseling from Millersville University, certified K-12. She began her career as a high school social studies teacher later becoming a school counselor. She said she always thought giving tours at Wheatland would be fun and has found that to be absolutely true!

April 11, 2022

Welcome: President Lauren Buchmann

Guest Speaker: **Norina Bentzel**, the principal at the North Hope-Winterstown Elementary School in the Red Lion School District, spoke about the day that a 52-year-old man, wielding a two-foot machete, randomly attacked 23 kindergarten children, their teacher, a third-grade teacher and herself in 2001. She spoke about the teacher heroism displayed on that day and about her severe injuries. She described the long physical and emotional healing process which enabled her to return to her school. Norina is currently writing a book about the experience, about the support needed during crisis, and about the emotional healing which alters life forever. It was an uplifting message about the tenacity of the human spirit.

The Treasurer's Report was accepted for audit.

President's Report: Lauren Buchmann reported that the LCSR/PASR Board wants to continue fulfilling our Mission Statement of offering annual student scholarships and teacher grants. Both have been impacted by the two-year inability to fund-raise for those projects due to the pandemic. Therefore, the LCSR Board has decided to do smaller fundraisers throughout the year along with requesting a one-time \$25 donation from each LCSR member to replace the funds usually raised at Monte Carlo. Hopefully, all members will support the fundraisers, make a \$25 donation, and continue to contribute to the Scholarship Fund so our Mission Statement can be accomplished.

The primary emphasis of that lobbying effort is obtaining a COLA (cost of living adjustment) for all PSERS annuitants.
