Introduction of Program: Chris Fitz from Advoz did a Power Point Presentation about Restorative Justice for offending juveniles before the criminal justice system is involved. He explained how mediation through face-to-face dialogue between the violator and the victim can restore relationships and lead to a resilient healthy response by the juvenile to a future crisis. The goal is to repair the harm caused by crime and to transform conflict and build community through facilitated dialogue. Mr. Fitz ended by inviting PASR members to volunteer, to donate or to mediate in partnership with Advoz.

MEMBERSHIP CONCERNS

Please read the Retirement Planning Article on page 7 and realize that membership recruiting and retention should be a goal of every member.

Since 2013 we have seen a steady decline in total membership of LCSR; total membership dropped from 1018 to 741. Records show 178 of our members died in those 5 years and 177 new members were recruited. This points to member *retention* as our main concern. Over the course of 5 years 313 members were dropped when they did not renew membership after a 6 month grace period and reminders to do so. Luncheon Program

"In Pursuit of Gentle Breezes: Hot Air Ballooning Around the World"

by Mary Ann Heltshe-Steinhauer.

Mary Ann will share the basics of hot air ballooning before taking us on her world-wide travels in search of gentle breezes. Be prepared to hear stories about her experiences as a balloonist in Albuquerque, Austria, Belgium, Costa Rica, Japan, Leningrad, Spain and Switzerland...and then back home in Lancaster County.

Mary Ann is employed by the Library System of Lancaster County where she serves as the PR/Community Relations Manager. She has spent over twenty years with the library system. She has a B.S. in Elementary Education/Library Science and a Masters of Education from Millersville University. She also has a Master of Library Science from Clarion University and post graduate studies in Folklore from University of Penn.



Most of her professional life has been spent in education, whether it was in the classroom as a teacher or in the school library as a teaching librarian (K-6) at Penn Manor School District. She's been an Instructional Support Team Leader at Coatesville Area School District, where she was responsible for a team that developed strategies for at-risk children. She loves to tell stories and has performed as a storyteller. From 1988 -1995 she was a representative agent for Children's Book Artists/Illustrators---where marketing and public relations were an integral part of her work.

In her spare time, Mary Ann likes to write and is a published author (***Multicultural Explorations: Joyous Journeys with Books***, Libraries Unlimited, 1991; ***Reading with a Smile***, Acropolis Books, 1975; photo illustrated ***Full of Hot Air*** written by Gary Paulsen, Delacorte, 1993.) She's also had articles published in ***The Christian Science Monitor***, ***Ballooning Journal*** and ***Balloon Life Magazine***.

She says she's often been accused of having her head in the clouds, as she is a licensed hot-air balloon pilot who has traveled all over the world in pursuit of gentle breezes. However, now she enjoys the gentle breezes felt while sitting and reading, as she watches the clouds drift aloft!

Every Spring, the North Museum of Nature and Science welcomes hundreds of students through field trips and group visits. When these groups want a special, in-depth experience of the museum, they choose a Guided Tour—and that's where our beloved volunteers come in. As a North Museum Guide, you'll lead groups of 15-20 students on an exhibit-by-exhibit tour (there are six in total) that lasts about 90 minutes and includes time for questions and exploration at each stop. You'll help students explore things like The Nature Gallery, the Live Animal Room, Dinosaurs, Nanotechnology, Ornithology, and Geology. If you love kids and have an interest in any area of science, this volunteer opportunity is perfect for you. Comprehensive training is provided. Most guides lead about 2 tours a month, but some come in weekly. We're open to working with you and whatever fits your schedule. NEARLY \$3,000 IN SCHOOL EMPLOYEE GRANTS AWARDED

As part of its mission to continue supporting education in retirement, LCSR awarded the following grants to local educators and schools in November and December for the 2018-19 school year.

Recipients are:

Matt Becker, Brian McClellan, Bob Needelman, Emily Rossman, and Nicole Reppert, 4th grade team, Fulton Elementary, Ephrata - \$200 as partial funding for materials for a STEM Community Impact Design Challenge in which all 4th grade students will research an issue in the community, pose a solution, design a prototype, and share their outcome and learning.

Kelcey Bucks, Librarian, Park Elementary - \$391 for creative construction material that will give students manipulatives for the library's STEM Initiative program.

Erin Campbell, Speech Language Pathologist, Columbia Middle and High School - \$200 for a Skoog, a tactile instrument that will attach to an IPAD and will provide a way for students with all types of disabilities the chance to make music, as well as aid in speech therapy.

Kristen Canady, Librarian, Schaeffer Elementary School - \$500 for flexible seating for the K-4 library

Beth Haldeman, Principal, Reamstown Elementary - \$200 as partial funding for the first elementary career day.

Mandee Hatcher, Kindergarten teacher, Park Elementary - \$434 for special playground equipment that will aid early childhood motor coordination and development.

Shari Miller, In-School Suspension Aide, Landisville Middle School - \$200 for materials to aid in helping "at risk" students be successful in the classroom throughout the year through a project called "Building Bridges".

Kristin Moritz, Kindergarten teacher, Park Elementary - \$461 for special books that will help students develop skills in reading, writing, and drawing pictures to go along with their writing.

Kerrie Snavely, Science teacher, Conestoga Valley High School - \$200 as partial funding for a special "green" storage rack for environmentally conscious stream study equipment.

Jeffrey Wile, Computer Science teacher, Warwick High School - \$200 as partial funding for Turing Tumbles, gear-based pegboards that use marbles to give students an additional physical/hands-on experience that help develop skills in coding concepts.

All projects for the grants are to be completed by June 30, 2019. Upon completion, the recipient is to submit a description and evaluation of the project, which will be shared in our newsletter and possibly at a membership luncheon meeting.





